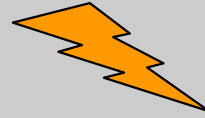

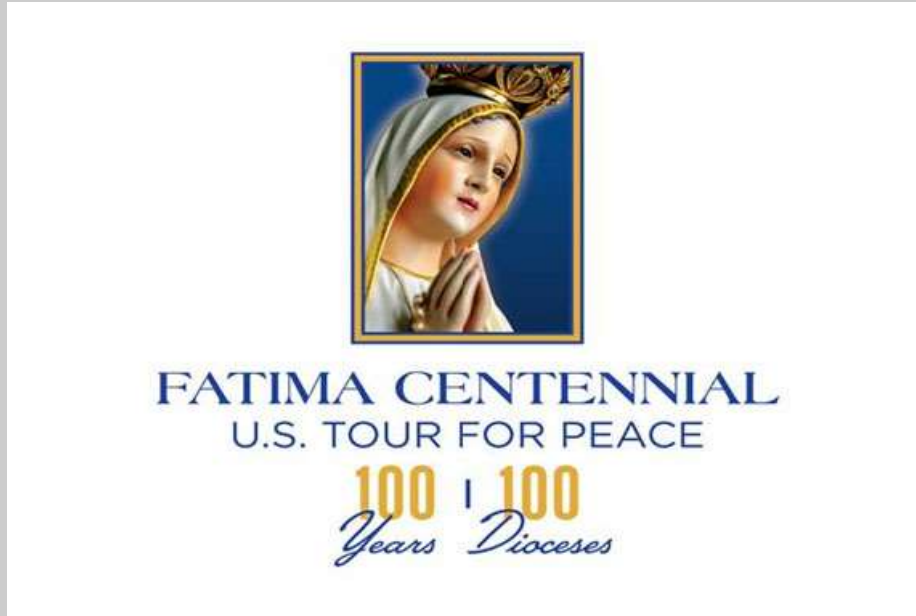

St Stephen Church will host the tour on Tuesday, December 13th. It will be an extraordinary occasion of healing, hope and grace. 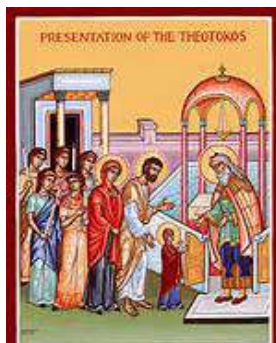
