Lightning Apologetics

Pentecost Sunday

I thought that since this is Pentecost Sunday, a little "lightning" catechism of the Holy Spirit would be in order. If you have not thought about the Holy Spirit much, then now is a good time for learning more and praying to Him for divine guidance. There is a beautiful novena to the Holy Spirit still in print.

Who is the Holy Spirit?

The Holy Spirit is the third Person of the Blessed Trinity and He proceeds eternally from the Father and the Son. The Holy Spirit is indeed God, completely equal to the Father and the Son. Like the Father and the Son, the Holy Spirit is almighty, eternal, and infinite.

How do we know about the Holy Spirit?

We learned about the Holy Spirit via divine revelation from Jesus Christ, who placed Him on an equal level with the Father and the Son.

Are there other names for the Holy Spirit?

Yes, there are many other names. He is called Advocate, Sanctifier, Spirit of Truth, Soul of the Church, Paraclete, Soul of My Soul, and Delightful Guest to name of the few.

When did Jesus promise to send the Holy Spirit?

He made the promise on numerous occasions. See Luke 24:49, John 14:26, John 15:26, Acts 1:8, et alia.

When did the Holy Spirit come upon the apostles in a visible way?

The Holy Spirit first manifested Himself in a visible way as tongues of fire on the first **Pentecost Sunday**. Through this manifestation of the Holy Spirit the apostles received the light to understand all that Jesus taught them. This new light, which is the power of the Holy Spirit, gave the apostles the zeal to preach what Jesus taught without fear—something that could be realized today, if priests and bishops would just call on the Holy Spirit for help.

What is the role of the Holy Spirit in the Church?

The Holy Spirit is the soul of the Church, making her holy by the grace of Jesus Christ. The Holy Spirit enables the Church to teach all that Jesus taught without the possibility of error (this is called infallibility). Finally, He transforms the members of the Church into witnesses for Christ. The Holy Spirit was sent by the Father and the Son to live in the Church until the end of time.

What is the role of the Holy Spirit in our lives?

Provided we are in a state of grace, the Holy Spirit dwells in our souls to make us holy with sanctifying grace. He enlightens our minds to know God, strengthens our wills to carry out God's will, and He sets our hearts on fire to love God and neighbor.

We should practice devotion to the Holy Spirit by praying to Him and asking Him to teach us to respond eagerly to His inspirations. If you want to live a life free of fear and anxiety, I strongly urge you to consider making an act of consecration to the Holy Spirit. The best book I've read on the Holy Spirit was "The Sanctifier." Still in print, you can get it at Pauline Books, on Veterans Memorial Boulevard, in Metairie.

I have not forgotten about the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit: wisdom, understanding, knowledge, counsel, piety, fortitude, and fear of the Lord. I have to write a separate article on these Gifts to explain them properly. Next week we will discuss the seven Gifts and show how important they are in our lives. God bless.


Rews
